The GPA was based on the Willys MB and Ford GPW Jeep design. When designing and building the GPA, Ford utilized many of the exact same parts that the Ford GPW jeep did. The GPA had an interior similar to that of the MB/GPW jeeps, surrounded by a watertight hull.

The Ford GPA, the amphibious jeep. A further roughly 13,000 amphibious jeeps were built by Ford under the name GPA (nicknamed "Seep" for "Sea Jeep"). Inspired by the larger DUKW, the vehicle was produced too quickly and proved to be too heavy, too unwieldy, and with insufficient freeboard.
